Service also extends to the Vernon Hills-IL Route 60/21 shopping area, Northwestern and Advocate Condell medical offices in Grayslake, and College of Lake County in Grayslake.


- Please call at least 24 hours in advance.

How Much Does It Cost?

One-Way Fares (exact change required):



- \$3.00 each way for trips under 10 miles for disabled and/or senior (age 60+).
- \$6.00 each way for trips over 10 miles for disabled and/or senior.

What Else Should I Know?

- · All vehicles are wheelchair accessible.
- This is a shared-ride service, the bus will pick up and drop off other passengers.
- This is a curb-to-curb service, drivers cannot escort riders outside of the vehicle or carry packages.
- Companions are limited to one person or child per registered rider (regular fares apply).
- Riders under age 16 must be accompanied by an adult (regular fares apply).
