This would probably be four people as the expenses are running about \$550.<sup>00</sup> per person. Here it was explained this was necessary to get an individual into a working situation, and the township holds a lien on the car.

Mrs. Frank Borst asked what the item "office rent \$1,000.<sup>00</sup>" in the budget included. This is an attempt to share office expenses relating to the General Town. It was agreed that the word "rent" was not a good term to use and should have been called Office Expense.

Mrs. Howard Thoren asked what salaries were included in the \$3,000.<sup>00</sup> figure budgeted. Mr. Bell told of a considerable amount of clerical work involved in order to process papers for aid recipients, and he felt this could be handled better by a clerk typist at least on a part time basis. Mr. Hertel moved to McHenry making a great loss to the Fremont community as well as this Town Board. Mr. Bell requested a motion that a resolution be adopted by the electors of this Annual Town Meeting commending Otto Hertel and thanking him for his long service to the Township of Fremont. In addition to this report, Mr. Bell asked members of the Board to give a brief report on some of the things we have been able to accomplish, while keeping healthy cash balances. This was done through the Federal Revenue Sharing funds, which are included in the General Town Fund Budget.

Robert Meyer explained the road projects that were undertaken. Approximately \$145,000.00 was spent in resurfacing four of the township roads. These roads were Chardon Road, Harris Road, Chewy Chase Road and Schuerman Road. If it hadn't been for these revenue sharing funds the above projects would have been necessary to go to the electors and request additional tax money.

Lorraine Koop reported on the Fremont Township Committee on Youth. This committee was formed in October of 1973 when the Board of Auditors appointed five members plus a liaison member, Lorie Koop. The first year was primarily for organization. Bylaws were written and approved by both the



Committee on Youth and the Town Board.

The first project was Township Clean up Day. This was done with the co-operation of the Highway Commissioner and his department.

There is a basket ball program every Thursday evening in the Fremont School gym, which has an adult supervising the activity. Presently the Committee is working on a contract with the Mundelein Park District, in order to allow the rural area residents to partake in their many programs, at no cost to the individuals. And finally Mrs Koop said, the Committee was looking for new members. They may contact her for information.

Mr. Reindel spoke regarding the fire districts in the Township. He said we are getting together with the five fire departments which serve Fremont Township. This has never been done before. We will be allocating revenue sharing funds for needed equipment purchases to aid the fire departments. So far we have been able to make commitments to the Mundelein and the Grayslake Fire Departments.

Mr. Bell reminded the electors of our involvement with local health services and clinics. These are low cost medical services for our needy residents.

Moved by Richard Johnson second by Mrs Mary Meyer, the General Town Financial Report be approved. Motion carried unanimously.

\$5,000.00 of Revenue Sharing funds through an



agreement with the Township Committee on Youth and the Mundelein Park District.

We are anticipating an additional allocation of \$5,000.<sup>00</sup> making their budget \$10,000.<sup>00</sup> for that program in the coming year.

Mr. Tom Rusnion was concerned about the future of the Committee on Youth. He asked if the program would continue if Federal Revenue Sharing funds are withdrawn after this year? Mr. Dill said that while the Committee on Youth is a legal Township function, and may be funded through the General Town funds, this would not necessarily happen. However the project would be re-evaluated at that time, and the Town Board would have to decide on the feasibility of continuing the project and the amount of funds available.

The Township was able to aid the Mundelein, Grayslake and Countryside Fire Departments, with purchasing telemetry equipment for their mobile intensive care rescue units amounting to approximately \$7,500.<sup>00</sup>. Similar requests have been made for these departments from the 1976-77 budget which will be adopted at the May Board meeting.

A proposed cooperative agreement between the Township and the Lake County Sheriff's Department is now being studied for added police protection within the Township boundaries. This could possibly be worked out through a Municipal Police Agency. A resolution was adopted by the Town Board for this purpose under the authorization of the Illinois Revised Statutes.

Mr. Titus reported on the roads that were improved during the past year. Casey and Lemon Roads were black topped through Revenue Sharing funds, while Bacon Rd



and Erhart Road were completed through Township road funding and motor fuel tax funds. Gravel sholdering was done on the above roads as well as Park Avenue, Chevy Chase, Chardon and Harris roads. Guard rails were installed at Sylvan Lake and on Susquehanna Road and Chevy Chase Road.

Mr. Titus stated he is working on a new project for center lining the black top roads through out the township. This will be made possible through Federal grant matching funds.

Mr. Bell gave a report on how the Township has operated during the 1976-1977 fiscal year. Two important factors brought out were the fact that the Township tax rate had been decreased and that money had been invested in interest bearing certificate of deposits for each of the above funds totaling more than \$20,000.<sup>00</sup>.

Mr. Bell further explained the litigation pending on Winchester House billing. The Township has charges amounting to approximately \$79,000.<sup>00</sup> for the past 2-2 1/2 yrs. This



represents the differential charges over and above an amount paid by State Aid. The Lower Courts have ruled that this charge is illegal and cannot be paid by the Township. The County of Lake has taken the matter to the Higher Courts. Mr. Bell said that the maximum rate a Township may levy for General Assistance is 10¢ per \$100.00 assessed valuation and no Township would be able to pay the charges and take care of any other responsibilities.

Mr. Richard Johnson voiced his concern over the #235 public housing development proposed in Mundelein, and what would the Township's obligations be if individual commitments were not fulfilled? Mr. Bell explained that this is always a large factor and some Township residents would most likely qualify for General Assistance.

Moved by Jack Harper, second by Paul Hertel that the electors here present vote For or Against a Permanent Road Improvement Tax not to exceed .15% of the full fair cash value as equalized or assessed annually by the Dept. of Revenue of the State of Illinois of all taxable property, including railroads, in said Stremont Township and Road District for a period of five years, for the purpose of constructing or maintaining gravel, rock, macadam, or other hard roads, or for improving, maintaining or repairing earth roads by draining, grading, oil treating, or dragging said roads located within said Town and Road District and having a petition signed by 25 legal voters requesting said vote be taken this 12th day of April, 1977. Motion carried as follows:

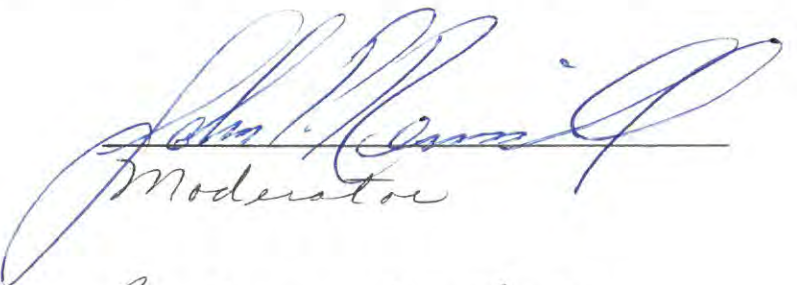
