Mr. Bell said that it would be very difficult, to begin with Townships do not have staffing personnel nor do they have any kind of publicity program in order to conduct promotional activities. It was

further expressed by the Board members that the program be undertaken by some formally organized group such as the P.T.A.'s or Church guild. No action was taken on this request.

Notice having been posted and published in the Independent-Register on April 27, 1977 and a letter being mailed to several organizations according to the new guidelines of the Federal Revenue Sharing Act, this meeting was called to order by Chairman, George Bell.

Mr. Bell explained to the guests present some of the rules and regulations for using the funds. Mr. Bell further stated that this was the third meeting at which Revenue Sharing was discussed.

Fremont Township has received approximately \$44,000.00 the first 3 yrs. It had been increased the last 2 yrs to \$52,000.00 and another \$2,000.00 increase is anticipated. We have so far been able to maintain a carry over balance. The tentative budget for the fiscal year Mar. 1, 1977 to Feb. 28, 1978 is as follows:

Fremont Township Trustees have tried to spread their Revenue Sharing funds over a large and

varied program. If an organization is based outside of the Township, The Board insists that a breakdown be given, showing the participation of Fremont residents, in order to justification of funding by this Township.

In the past 3 yrs we have aided Mundelein Fire Dept (\$5,000.); Countryside Fire Dept (\$2,000); and Grayslake Fire Dept (\$500.). These figures were arrived at by a division of population.

We have already spent \$7,500.00 - gr. payment for police protection, \$500.00 to Grayslake Fire Dept and \$550.00 to Santa Abierta.

Mr. Wm Runnion, Chairman, Township Comm. on Youth, expalied how under Ill. Statutes, this committee works combat juvenile delinquents.

Mr. Runnion submitted a proposed budget for the 1977-1978 year as follows:

Mund. Park Dist contract \$4,000.00; Mundelein Sports Complex \$4,500.00; Lake County Youth Service Bureau (Mund. Greenhouse) \$3,400.00; Miscellaneous Youth Programs (newly developed during the year) \$2,000.00. Total Proposed Budget \$18,900.00

Mr. Alex Mark, <sup>Director,</sup> spoke in behalf of the Mund. Park Dist. He submitted a report detailing participation Township residents residing outside of Mundelein. There 870 (or 239 people) would not have been considered if this agreement had not been approved. A larger number of people is anticipated as more Township residents become aware of the program.

Mr. Don Downs, chairman of the Greenhouse a part of the Lake County Youth Service Bureau, told how they try to provide direct service to the youth of Fremont Township. He work with 9 or 10 other organizations who are either involved with or actual members of the Greenhouse program. Mr. Downs introduced the

A township landscaping proposal was presented by the Casey Landscaping firm in the amount of \$2,000.00 after some items had been removed.

Mr. Bill Mills spoke in behalf of the Mundelein

Lions Club who is working with the Fremont Library, on a project for special cassette tape machines to aid the deaf or blind. The estimated cost of 5 machines is \$1,500.00

Ms Connie Sharp spoke for the Lake County Community Day Treatment Program for the severely disturbed adults. They need funds to maintain and service a van used to transport these people throughout the county. No specific amount was requested.

Requests were made by the following organizations. There were no amounts specified nor were there representatives present. The Legal Service Bureau of Lake County and Fremont School Dist #79. The school district needs equipment and improvements to their property for a summer recreation program. They will be referred to the Comm on Youth.

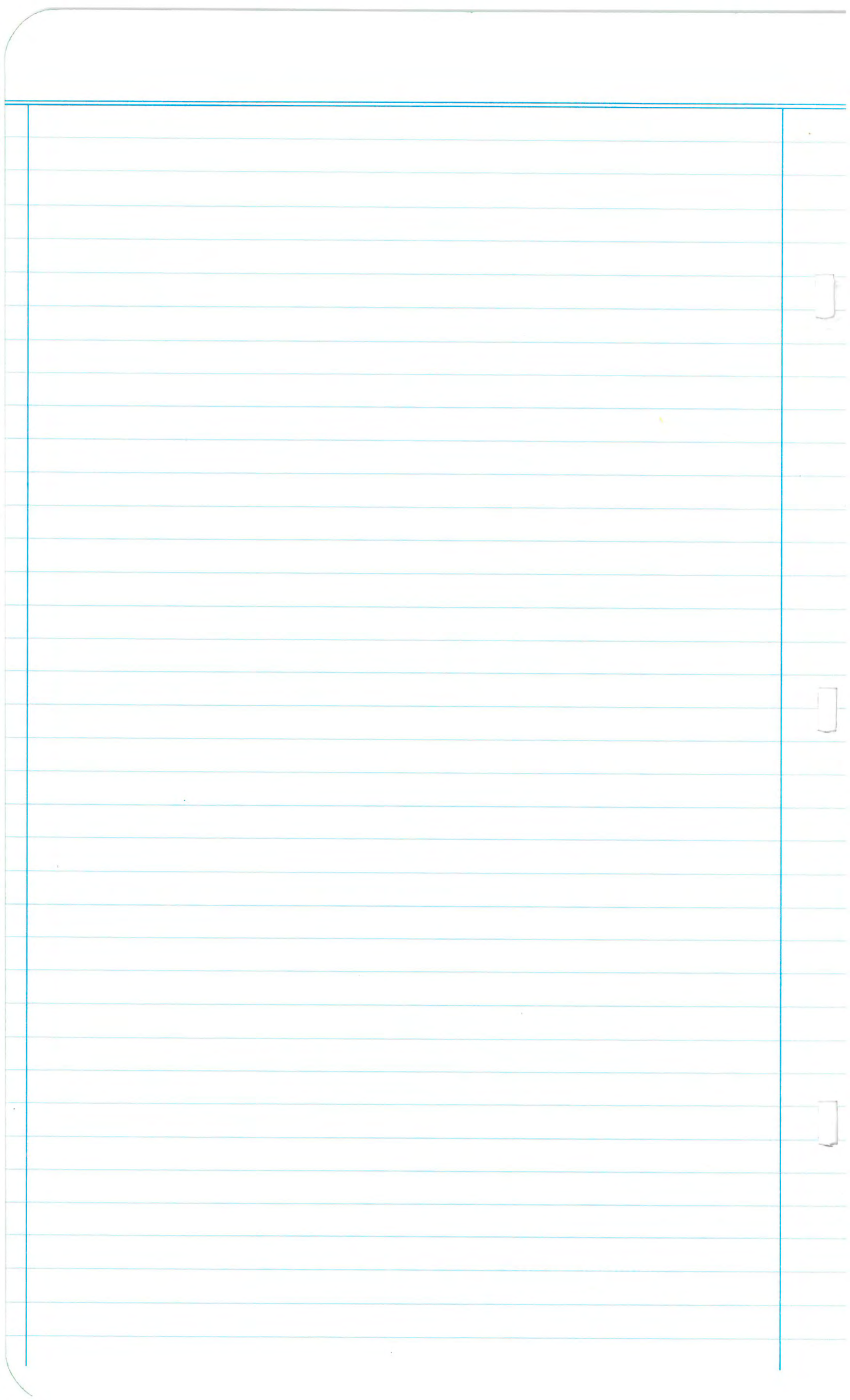
